

# JSPCA Animals' Shelter Rehoming Process

## BIRDS



1

Fill out an application form at Reception or online. This form will be kept for a maximum of one year.



2

You will receive a call from the JSPCA if we have a suitable bird for you. Alternatively, if you see a bird advertised on the JSPCA website or social media, please contact our Reception to express interest.

3

If a bird is a suitable match for you, you will be asked to come in for a chat with one of our team and to meet the creature. We will ask to see Landlord's permission (if you live in rented accommodation) and proof of address (e.g. a utility bill) from the past two months.

4

If the JSPCA team feel that you and your home is suitable for the animal, you will be asked to come in for a certain number of viewings. This is dependent on the bird's requirements. A home visit will also be required where you will need to show the enclosure you have, or you may be asked to supply photos and measurements.

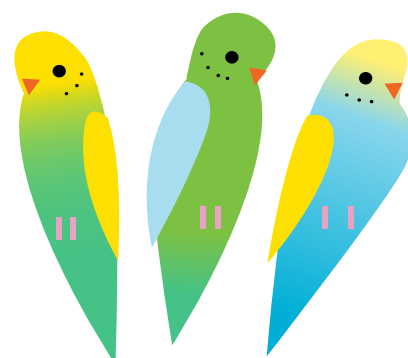
Once a home visit has been completed (if required), enclosure has been approved, the required number of viewings has taken place, you will be able to adopt them and they will be reserved for you. You will then need to register the animal with a private Vet practice and the JSPCA will send over its history. The JSPCA asks for a minimum donation for adopting an animal. This is to cover some of the overhead costs of preparing them for rehoming. Paperwork is then to be completed on adoption - the Reception team will assist.

Once everyone is happy that everything is completed, you'll be able to arrange a time with the JSPCA team to collect your new pet and take them home.
